### Who may vote?

To cast a ballot in the May 2019 Bond Election you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a registered voter.  
(Must be registered by April 4, 2019)
- The address on your voter registration certificate must be within the Medina Valley Independent School District boundaries.

## MEDINA VALLEY ISD 2019 BOND ELECTION INFORMATION

The Medina Valley ISD Board of Trustees has called for a \$107 million bond election.

### Proposed Projects

- 2 new elementary schools
- Add-on and Complete Existing High School, which includes:
  - >New 800-student addition
  - >Addition to the Performing Arts Center
  - >Renovation to existing high school buildings
  - >Additional High School Parking/Paving
- Land Acquisition for future school sites

## What is a Bond Election



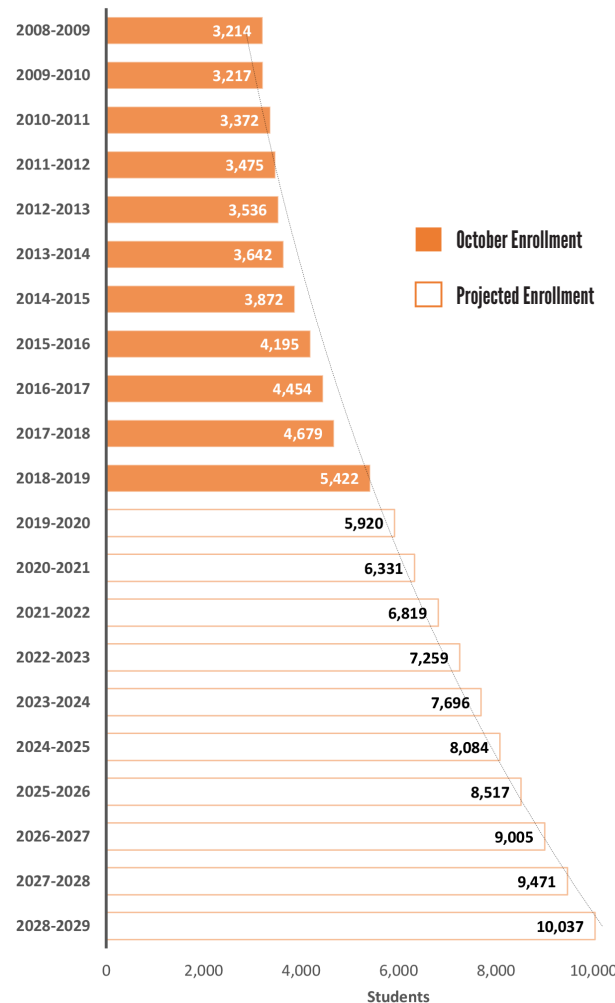
The state of Texas allows public school districts to issue bonds as a means to help fund major capital improvements such as building new schools, making major renovations or expansions to existing facilities, and purchasing school sites. Bonds provide a way for public schools to borrow money for projects and then repay the principal and interest over an extended period of time, much in the same way an individual finances a home with a mortgage. However, the law also provides that a school district must hold an election to receive authorization from the voters to sell bonds and to levy and collect taxes to repay those bonds.

## The proposition on the ballot will ask voters to consider:

“THE ISSUANCE OF \$107,000,000 OF BONDS BY THE MEDINA VALLEY INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR SCHOOL FACILITIES AND THE LEVYING OF A TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF.”

## ANTICIPATED GROWTH

- Enrollment has increased 1,780 students or 49% over the past five years.
- Demographic reports estimate the district will grow another 2,200+ students over the next five years exceeding the capacity of the district's current facilities.



## TAX IMPACT

- After the \$25,000 homestead exemption, the average home value in the Medina Valley ISD is \$160,022.
- If approved, it is anticipated that the May 4th bond election would require a tax rate increase of approximately \$.10 per \$100 of valuation. This would result in an annual increase of approximately \$160 on the average home value.
- With the exception of future improvements, there is no tax increase above the frozen level on the homestead of a **disabled person** or on **taxpayers 65 years of age and older** who have applied for and received an exemption and have not substantially improved their property.
